Volunteer Opportunities at Ladew Gardens

Field Trips:

Train to teach environmental education to preschool to elementary aged children in the gardens and/or Nature Walk trail. Present topics including seeds and flowers, trees, signs of the season and more.

Requirements:

- Minimum of 16 years of age
- Required to get fingerprinted for MD State and FBI Background Check (fee is reimbursed by Ladew)
- Enthusiasm for and experience in working with children in pre-K through 5th grades and/or middle school.
- Train to lead pre-K through 5th grade students in environmental education programs.
- Lead 8-12 children on walking tours of the gardens and/or Nature Walk trail.
- Background in or interest in learning about topics in natural history, botany, horticulture, biology, or environmental studies
- o Good communication skills
- Ability to walk for up to 1 ½ hours at a time.
- During your first training season, commit to lead a minimum of 2 school programs.
- Time commitment is flexible: lead anywhere from once a month to once a week or more (April, May, September, October and possibly July & August)
- Observation by education staff may be required.

Camp:

Assist paid educators with a morning or full day of activities, including hikes, outdoor games, crafts, puppet show, story time, etc.

Requirements:

- Minimum of 14 years of age
- Required to get fingerprinted for MD State and FBI Background Check (fee is reimbursed by Ladew)
- Time Commitment: would prefer that volunteers commit to 2 to 5 days in a camp week.
- Ability to walk for up to 1 ½ hours at a time, often in heat of summer.
- Assist with camp set up; arrive 30 minutes before camp starts each day; depending on the week, could be a 4-hour day or a 6-hour day.
- Assist clean up each day; stay 30 minutes after camp ends each day.
- Assist with all activities, including lessons, indoor/outdoor games and arts & craft activities.
- perform puppet shows or read for story time, if interested
- supervise bathroom breaks and snack/lunchtimes.

Butterfly House Docenting:

Teach visitors to our Butterfly House about butterflies and the plants they depend on. Help supervise and act as house host/docent during public viewing times.

Requirements:

- Minimum age 14
- Attend training sessions to learn about our butterfly focus species and their life cycles.
- Training is typically in May (online videos) and June (in person). Both video training and inperson training are required for new volunteers.
- Keep up with weekly informational emails, particularly prior to upcoming docent commitments.
- Shadow veteran docents prior to being a house docent. (Typically, twice is enough)
- Observe eggs, caterpillars, chrysalides, and butterflies in the house.
- Observe and become familiar with plants in the Butterfly House, particularly host and nectar plants.
- Use the Volunteer Hub online platform to schedule your docent sessions.

Maple Magic:

Train to teach the general public (all ages) about maple sugaring in the wintertime. Roles include Tour Guide, Fire Pit/Sap Boiling Leader, Syrup Taste Testing Station Leader.

Requirements:

- Minimum of 16 years of age
- Attend a 3-hour training session in early February.
- Tour Guide: ability to share sugaring info and walk on Nature Walk trail for up to 1 ½ hour; trail can be muddy and/or icy.
- Fire Pit Leader: ability to safely tend a fire, boil sap and share boiling facts outdoors for up to 4 hours.
- Syrup Taste Testing Station Leader: ability to share info about sap and syrup outdoors for up to 4 hours or more w/a co-volunteer.
